## Ballot Instructions

**Please use a black or blue ink pen to mark your ballot.**

To vote for your choice in each contest, completely fill in the box next to your choice.

**Vote for only one choice in each contest.**

Making more than one choice in a contest is an overvote and no votes for that contest will be counted.

**Correcting a mistake:**

Draw a line through the incorrect choice. You may then make another choice if you wish. Do not use white-out or erase.

**Ballot measure information** is available in the Online Voters' Guide at [www.islandcountywa.gov/auditor/elections](http://www.islandcountywa.gov/auditor/elections). Select the MyVote icon and sign in to see the items specific to your ballot.

**Accessible Voting Equipment** is available at the Elections Office, 400 N. Main St., Coupeville, 18 days prior to Election Day from 9:00 am until 4:00 pm; on Election Day only from 9:00 am to 8:00 pm.

**Place your voted ballot in the pink security envelope**, seal and place the pink security envelope in the colored return envelope.

**Sign and date the Voter's Declaration on the return envelope.**

If you are unable to sign, make your mark, have it witnessed and signed by two (2) other people. A Power of Attorney is not allowed for any voting purpose.

**Contact County elections** to request a new ballot if your current ballot is lost, destroyed or spoiled or go to [www.myvote.wa.gov](http://www.myvote.wa.gov).

**No postage is required if depositing a ballot in a ballot drop box.**

**If returning your ballot by mail**, affix First Class Postage on the return envelope. Ballots must be postmarked no later than Election Day. Ballots with a late postmark will not be counted.

## Oak Harbor School District No. 201, Proposition No. 1

### Proposition No. 1 - School Program Levies

The Board of Directors of Oak Harbor School District No. 201 adopted Resolution No. 16-6 concerning a proposition for partial financing of operation and maintenance expenses. This proposition would replace the expiring levies by authorizing levies of the following excess taxes for the District's General Fund upon all taxable property in the District to provide funds for operation and maintenance of the District:

**Stanwood Camano School District No. 401,  
Proposition No. 1**

**Proposition No. 1 - Bonds to Construct,  
Renovate and Improve School Facilities -  
\$147,500,000**

The Board of Directors of Stanwood-Camano School District No. 401 adopted Resolution No. 2016/2017-001 concerning bonds to replace educational facilities and improve safety and infrastructure. This proposition would authorize the District to construct a new high school replacing Stanwood High School; construct a new building for Lincoln Hill High and Saratoga Schools; relocate technology and school maintenance facilities, and undertake other capital improvements; issue \$147,500,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum term of 21 years, and levy excess property taxes annually to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 2016/2017-001.
