## Island County Wastewater Holding Tank Disposal

## The Essentials

If you own a recreational vehicle (RV), a mobile food truck, or a stationary RV, you're likely familiar with black and grey wastewater holding tanks. It's important to know how to properly dispose of their contents.

### What is Considered Sewage?

Washington State and Island County Code classify both blackwater and greywater as sewage. This means that the contents of both your greywater and blackwater holding tanks must be disposed of safely and properly.

### Options for Disposal

In Island County, wastewater holding tanks may be disposed of at designated dump stations or by a licensed septage pumper.

**Food Trucks** may only visit the designated dump station specified on their pre-approved servicing agreement form and must retain copies of dumping records.

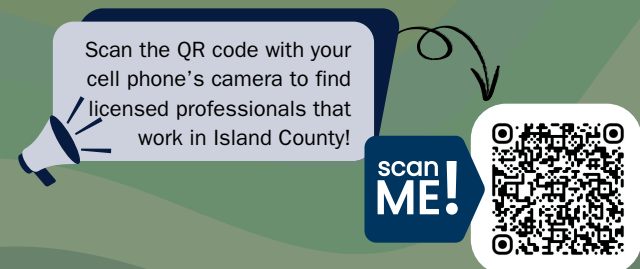
## Sewage Pumpers

### Stationary Vehicles

If your RV is stationary, driving to a Dump Station may not be an option for you.

In this situation, contact a **licensed sewage pumper** to come out to remove the contents of your holding tank(s). Be sure to maintain records of each pumping service.

**IMPORTANT:** Do not attempt to transport the waste yourself. Only licensed septage haulers are legally allowed to remove and transport sewage waste.
