STATEMENT REGARDING COVID-19 Island County, August 24, 2021

FDA approved the first COVID-19 vaccine

On Monday, August 23, 2021, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved the first COVID-19 vaccine for regular use. Pfizer-BioNTech was previously approved as an emergency use authorization (EUA) COVID-19 vaccine.

Key points are:

- Will now be named as Comirnaty (koe-mir'-na-tee),
- For the prevention of COVID-19 disease in individuals 16 years of age and older,
- The Pfizer emergency use vaccine is still available for individuals 12 through 15 years of age.

Comirnaty has the same formula as the emergency use authorization vaccine and is given as a series of two doses, three weeks apart.

FDA-approved vaccines undergo the agency's standard process for reviewing the quality, safety, and effectiveness of medical products.
