The WRIA 6 Lead Entity is responsible for implementing our salmon recovery chapter of the Puget Sound Chinook Recovery Plan. The Island County Salmon Recovery Technical & Citizen Committee (SRTCC) is the decision making body of the Lead Entity. The committee structure is defined in RCW 78.85.050 (1)(b):

“The lead entity shall establish a committee that consists of representative interests of counties, cities, conservation districts, tribes, environmental groups, business interests, landowners, citizens, volunteer groups, regional fish enhancement groups, and other habitat interests. The purpose of the committee is to provide a citizen-based evaluation of the projects proposed to promote salmon habitat.”

Members representing Tribes, conservation districts, governmental agencies and regional fish enhancement groups are selected by those organizations they represent and are approved by SRTCC.

Members representing business interests, landowners, citizens, environmental groups, volunteer groups and other habitat interests are appointed by the Board of Island County Commissioners upon recommendation from SRTCC. These members are required to use this form so that SRTCC can make this recommendation.
