

Jurisdiction	Definition of Winery
Clark	<p>"Winery" means a licensed facility designed for the crushing, fermentation, and/or barrel aging of wine, and which may include barrel rooms, bottling rooms, tank rooms, laboratories, case goods storage, and offices. In rural zoning and urban holding districts a winery may include a tasting room and/or events. "Licensed" for the purposes of this title means a facility that has met the requirements of RCW 66.24.170 and 27 CFR Chapter 1, Subchapter A, Part 1. <i>(Amended: Ord. 2010-10-02; Ord. 2011-08-08; Ord. 2013-08-11)</i></p>
Benton	<p>"Wineries/Breweries" means facilities where fruit or other products are processed into wine or spirits and related storage, bottling, shipping, sampling, tasting and sale of such.</p>
Chelan	<p>"Winery" means a facility where fruit or other products are processed (i.e., crushed, blended, aged, and/or bottled) and may include as incidental and/or accessory to the principal use a tasting room, food and beverage service, places of public/private assembly, and/or retail sales area. (Res. 2012-78 (part), 8/14/12).</p>
King	<p>Winery: An establishment primarily engaged in one or more of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. Growing grapes or fruit and manufacturing wine, cider or brandies; B. Manufacturing wine, cider, or brandies from grapes and other fruits grown elsewhere; and C. Blending wines, cider or brandies. (Ord. 15974 § 5, 2007).
Lewis	<p>Does not have a definition but include viticulture in the definition of agriculture.</p>
Skagit	<p>Does not have a definition but include viticulture in the definition of agriculture.</p>
Skamania	<p>"Wine sales/tasting room" means a facility that is accessory to a winery and used for tasting and retail sales of wine, including interior space (e.g., wine bar, sitting room) and exterior space (e.g., patio, veranda). A wine sales/tasting room shall not be used for preparing or serving meals or hosting weddings, receptions, or other commercial events, unless allowed, reviewed, and approved under Section 22.12.030 of this title. A wine sales/tasting room is distinct from a winery; each of these uses must be explicitly reviewed and approved.</p> <p>"Winery" means an agricultural facility used for processing grapes into wine, including laboratories, processing area, offices, and storage areas. A winery is distinct from a wine sales/tasting room; each of these uses must be explicitly</p>

	reviewed approved.
Stevens	Wineries/Breweries: A business that produces and/or serves beers or wines intended for consumption on the premises as an accessory use.
Thurston	<p>"Winery (small scale)" means a small scale winery limited to twenty-thousand square feet in size, which utilizes fruit and berries grown in the Pacific Northwest in the production of wine."</p> <p>3.3</p> <p>"Agritourism Overlay District (AOD)" means an overlay zoning district covering an area defined by the official Thurston County Zoning Map, which incorporates the standards of the underlying zoning district. The main goal of the AOD is to support local agriculture and provide alternatives to the conversion of farm land through sustainable rural economic development and empowering farmers to attempt new, entrepreneurial endeavors which augment, support and highlight local agriculture.</p> <p>Uses permitted within the AOD include, but are not limited to agricultural home stays, farm kitchens and bakeries, educational and interpretive seminars, you pick operations (Christmas trees, pumpkin patches, berry picking etc.), day tours, cooking and food preservation classes, elder hostels, petting zoos, horseback riding, zip lines/aerial rope slide courses, photography, nature watching, temporary gatherings, farm weddings and festivals, country inns, small scale wineries, craft distilleries and micro-breweries. Non-listed agritourism uses within the AOD are subject to the standards of <u>Chapter 20.08G TCC</u>, unless such uses are specifically exempt from Thurston County review and approval.</p>
Walla Walla	<p>Wineries/Breweries: A business that produces and/or serves beers or wines intended for consumption on the premises as an accessory use.</p> <p>17.22.040 - Events.</p> <p>A.</p> <p>For all wineries, Walla Walla Wine Alliance functions, trade-related functions, wine club events, winemaker dinners and regional promotional events such as <u>Holiday Barrel Tasting Weekend</u>, <u>Spring Release Weekend</u>, and Walla</p>

	<p>Walla Balloon Stampede Weekend are part of the normal operations of a winery, as is the daily traffic associated with a tasting room. Capacity is limited by building occupancy and parking limitations.</p> <p>B.</p> <p>Events not related to the operational and marketing aspects of the winery, such as weddings, receptions, and meetings/retreats, shall be limited to not more than three large (two hundred fifty guests maximum) and twenty-four small (seventy-five guests maximum) events per year per legal lot of record. Capacity is limited by building occupancy and parking limitations.</p> <p>C.</p> <p>For Type II wineries, the hearing examiner may place a limit on the number of or size of events allowed. This is to be based on findings of fact which specify the need to mitigate impacts via these limitations. (Ord. 364 § 3(part), 2008)</p>
Whatcom	Does not have a definition but include viticulture in the definition of agriculture.
Yakima	<p>"Winery" means an agriculturally related industrial facility where wine is processed and manufactured. A winery is specifically designed to include, at a minimum, two or more of the following: vineyards, crushing, fermentation, and barrel aging of wine. A winery may also include any of the following: barrel rooms, bottling rooms, tank rooms, laboratories, and offices. Uses that are clearly incidental to the production of wine are allowed accessory uses to a winery. These may include, but are not limited to, the following: bottling, case goods storage, retail and/or wholesale sales of wine, employee day care, tours, tasting and sales rooms when they are accessory to the on-site production facility and, ancillary retail sales, picnic areas, and food service. Food service is limited by the type of Yakima Health District License, Agricultural Tourist Operation or commercial zoning district where the winery is located.</p>
RCW 66.04.010	<p>"Winery" means a business conducted by any person for the manufacture of wine for sale, other than a domestic winery.</p> <p>"Domestic winery" means a place where wines are manufactured or produced within the state of Washington.</p>
