Animal Fecal Waste \$115/ton. Double bagged.
Notify the scale house attendant.

Appliances \$22.50 each. Washers, dryers, dish-
washers, water heaters, freezers, refrigerators, air
conditioners, water coolers, etc. See *Other Disposal
Options* for disposal of non-refrigerating appli-
ances.

Asbestos Not accepted. Contact the Northwest
Clean Air Agency 360-428-1617.

Ashes \$115/ton. Notify the scale house attendant.

Batteries Free. Tape exposed terminals on dry cell
batteries.

Cell Phones Free. Place in plastic bag and recycle
with household batteries.

Concrete, Bricks, Dirt \$115-\$136/ton.

Construction/Demolition/Bulky \$136/ton. Includes
wood, windows, insulation, carpet, carpet pad, and
bulky items such as furniture.

Cooking Oil Free. Label container, notify the scale
house attendant.

E-cycle Free. Monitors, televisions, computers, lap-
tops, tablets & eReaders.

Hard to Handle \$170/ton. Items over 6 feet e.g.,
mattresses, lumber, couches, etc.

Hazardous Waste, Business Fee. Accepted by ap-
pointment, call 629-4522 ext. 7386.

Hazardous Waste, Household Free. Antifreeze,
gasoline, oil-based paints, fertilizers, pesticides,
acids, bases, fluorescent bulbs, lead, PBC ballasts,
propane tanks, mercury devices, etc. Notify the
scale house attendant.

Latex/Acrylic Paint \$115/ton. Thickened to a non-
pourable consistency. For additional information
see site attendant.

Metal \$115-\$136-\$170/ton depends on size. See
Other Disposal Options.

Motor Oil Free. Notify scale house attendant.

Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) \$115/ton. Regular
household garbage, includes sheet rock and 3-tab
shingles.

Printer cartridges Free.

**Sharps, Pharmaceutical, Bio-Medical or Bloody
Waste** Ask scale house attendant or call Hazardous
Waste at 629-4522 ext. 7386 for more information.

Tires \$7.50 each, for passenger car or light truck.
Larger tires by weight. See *Other Disposal Options*.

Yard Waste \$80/ton. Yard waste includes grass
clippings, brush, trees, etc. Debris must be re-
moved from bags.

SECURE YOUR LOAD FOR SAFER ROADS.... IT'S THE LAW!

EXAMPLES OF SECURED LOADS



Netting, straps, rope, and bungee cord can be used to tie each large item to the vehicle. Since there is nothing in the load that can blow out, a cover is not needed.

Garbage cans are secured to the truck with a strap. Lids are secured with bungee cords.



Tarp covers the entire load and is secured with cargo netting.

INADEQUATELY SECURED LOADS

Tie downs are missing. Debris can fall or fly out of moving vehicle. Load should be covered with tarp and cargo net.



Tie downs are inadequate. Top, sides and back of load is not secure. Vehicle is overloaded. Load should be secured with straps and/or cargo net.

Debris can fall or fly out. Load should be secured to the trailer with rope, netting and/or straps.



FACTS

- ◆ Roughly 40 percent of litter on highways comes from unsecured loads.
- ◆ It is estimated that road litter causes 25,000 accidents in North America each year, nearly 100 of which are fatal.
- ◆ Every year, road debris causes about 400 accidents on Washington State highways.
- ◆ 40 percent of the litter-related violations issued by Washington State Patrol in 2007 were for a failure to secure a load; 21 percent were issued for debris escaping from those loads.
- ◆ More than 12 million pounds of litter comes from vehicles each year in Washington State.

WASHINGTON STATE FINES

- ◆ \$216 fine for transporting an unsecured load.
- ◆ Up to \$5,000 fine with potential for jail time if an item falls off the vehicle and causes property damage or bodily injury.
- ◆ \$103 fine for a small thing like a piece of paper. Up to \$5,000 for bigger items such as furniture.

HOW TO SECURE YOUR LOAD

- ◆ **Tie down.** Use rope, bungee cords, netting or straps. Tie larger items directly to your vehicle.
- ◆ **Lighter goes lower.** Put lighter items at the bottom of the load, and weigh them down so they don't blow out.
- ◆ **Don't overload.** Keep material level with truck bed or trailer if at all possible.
- ◆ **Double-check.** Always double-check your load. Ask yourself, "Would I feel safe driving behind my vehicle? If the answer is, "No," then you need to do a better job of securing your load.

MATERIALS TO SECURE YOUR LOAD

Tarps, netting, ropes, straps, chains, bungee cords, and cargo bar.

RECYCLING

Clean Paper

Cardboard (flattened), News papers, Magazines, Catalogs, Phonebooks, Mail (window envelopes OK) Paper bags, food boxes, Wrapping paper (non foil)

Clean Paper Food Containers

Clean paper cups, Milk & juice cartons, Juice boxes, Frozen food boxes

Clean Plastic

Plastic cups, Bottles, jars & jugs (food, detergent, shampoo, vitamins, etc.), Plastic food tubs , (yogurt, cream cheese, etc). **NO lids or caps**

Clean Metal

Aluminum cans and steel cans

Clean Glass

Bottles & Jars (all colors & sizes). **NO lids or caps**

Items **NOT** Accepted in Recycling Bins:

Food residue, Plastic bags, Shredded paper, Styrofoam, Packaging peanuts, Paper towels, Plates, Napkins, Disposable diapers, Rags, Bathroom tissue paper, Plastic take-out containers, Plastic trays, Plastic plates, Utensils, Prescription vials, Food wraps, Toxic containers (paint, oil, antifreeze, pesticides, etc.), Foil trays, Aluminum foil, Needles, Syringes, Sharp or greasy items, Ceramics, Dishes, Light bulbs, Windows, Mirrors, Ribbons, Bows, Stemware
